# ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Rajiv Gandhi Government Degree College, popularly known as Kotshera, is located in Chaura Maidan, Shimla. The campus is situated near the picturesque and serene Inverarm Hill, one of the seven hills in the city. A narrow downhill trail from opposite the historic Cecil Hotel, canopied by thick and lush green deodar and rhododendron groves, leads to the college campus. The college is ensconced amidst a pristine natural environment offering a perfect academic setting for the students. Surrounded by prestigious institutions like The Academy of Indian Audit and Accounts, *Yarrows* and the renowned *Annadale* helipad, the college building offers a mesmerizing view of snow clad mountains and thick woods. The college has the rare *Cryptomeria japonica* trees, very few of which can be found in the city.

The old building of the college was a colonial, palatial house named the Kotshera House, from which the college got its name. The pre-independence history of the place is said to have deep connections with a family belonging originally to Gujranwala in the erstwhile Punjab. The building served as the office of the Himachal Pradesh Education Board for a few years, before being set up as a degree college. Its journey as an educational institution began by serving as the Humanities wing of Government Degree College, Sanjauli in the year 1984.

The college has made immense progress and grown in stature all through its glorious journey. At present, the college campus spreads over wide area having strength of 3000 students. It is transforming into a leading co-educational institution of the state offering undergraduate courses in all three streams viz. Humanities, Sciences and Commerce. Varied job-oriented professional courses like Bachelor of Computer Applications (for which a separate prospectus is available), Information Technology, Journalism and Mass Communication and Tourism and Travel Management are being offered by the college to provide a cutting edge to the students.

# CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

Rajiv Gandhi Government Degree College follows New Choice based Credit System (CBCS) of UGC which has been approved by Executive Council of Himachal Pradesh University.

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising Core, Elective and Skill based courses. The courses can be evaluated following the Grading System, which is considered to be better than the conventional marking system. Therefore, it is necessary to introduce uniform grading system in the entire higher education in India. This will benefit the students to move across institutions both within India and across countries. The uniform grading system will also enable potential employers in assessing the performance of the candidates. In order to bring uniformity in evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed.

Outline of Choice Based Credit System:

- 1. Core Course: A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed
- 2. Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
- 2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective Courses, offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).
- 2.2 Dissertation/Project: An Elective Course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.
- 2.3 Generic Elective (GE) Course: An Elective Course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective.
- \* A Core Course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.
- 3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC).
- 3.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC): These are mandatory for all disciplines. These courses are based the content that leads to knowledge enhancement; i. Environmental Science and ii. English/MIL Communication.
- 3.2 SEC: These courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.
- 4. An undergraduate degree with Honours in a discipline may be awarded if a student completes 14 core papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 4 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective and Generic Elective papers respectively.
- 5. An undergraduate degree in Science disciplines may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in three disciplines of choice, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on three disciplines of choice selected above, respectively.

- 7. The term 'Credit' refers to the weightage given to a course, usually in terms of the number of instructional hours per week assigned to it. This explains why 'credit' is usually taken to mean 'credit hours'. For the purpose of credit determination, instruction is divided into three components:

LECTURES (L)-Classroom lectures of one hour duration.

TUTORIALS (T)-Special, elaborate instructions on specific topics (From Lecture) of one hour duration.

PRACTICALS (P)-Laboratory of field exercises in which the student has to do experiments or other practical work of two hour duration.

Each one of these components is considered as equal to one credit. One Lecture (L) as well as one Tutorial (T) of one hour a week is considered as one credit, whereas one Practical (P) of two hours a week is considered as one credit. The total weightage given to a course in terms of credits will be equal to L+T+P. This can be written in symbols as: C=L+T+CP, Where, C is the credit weightage for a particular course.

# ADMISSION PROCEDURE (FOR FIRST YEAR STUDENTS)

Read the instructions and procedure thoroughly before filling up the admission form for any course.

- 1. A student seeking admission to the first year of the degree course will approach the Admission Committee of the college after procuring the Prospectus-cum-Handbook of Information from the College. DO NOT FILL UP THE ADMISSION FORM WITHOUT CONSULTING THE ADMISSION COMMITTEE.
- 2. The Admission Committee will guide the students about the different courses and subject combinations including compulsory courses, core courses, elective courses and hobby courses, if any, available with the college. The committee will also guide them about the possible subject combinations they can opt for.
- 3. For all the relevant information regarding the college notification, faculty information, links are available on the college website.
- 4. Change of subject is allowed only with the permission of the Principal within 10 days of the commencement of teaching. Change of faculty i.e. from Science to Arts and vice-versa is permissible only if the candidate has the required percentage of marks as specified for admission to that faculty.
- 5. A candidate who has passed Prabhakar examination without passing 10+2 examination shall not be eligible for admission to any course in the college.
- 6. Candidates are required to be present physically on the day of admission and bring the original documents, self attested photocopies and 3 passport size photographs.
- 7. Candidate, who does not report on the day of counselling, will lose the right to admission.
- 8. The college may discontinue a course of study if adequate number of students is not available in a particular course.
- A student admitted to the college under CBCS will have to abide by all the rules and regulations of the college as stipulated in the college prospectus/students' charter.

10. Applicants for II<sup>nd</sup> Year and V <sup>th</sup> semester will fill up their promotion forms which will be available in the office. However, admission to 2nd year shall only be on provisional basis. If the candidate fails in 1st year, He/She will have to repeat 1st year.

#### **ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS**

#### For 1st Year Students

- Candidate must have passed 10+2 from a recognized Board/University established by the Law of India with English as compulsory subject.
- 2. Maximum age limit is 21 years for boys and 23 years for girls as on July 1, 2019.
- 3. For SC/ST candidates, a relaxation of three years in age is allowed.
- 4. The Vice-Chancellor, HPU may, in exceptional cases/circumstances (to be recorded in writing) give relaxation in age up to a maximum of six months to any candidate. All such cases of age relaxation of up to six months may be granted admission provisionally by the Principal and a consolidated list of all such cases will be sent for approval of the Vice-Chancellor by 31st October of every academic year.
- 5. Relaxation in upper age limit is also available to physically disabled candidates.

### Documents/Certificates required at the time of admission

- 1. Matriculation certificate for date of birth.(Attested Photocopy)
- 2. 10+2 Marks sheet (Internet copy not valid, attested photocopy).
- 3. 3 copies of passport size photographs.
- 4. Character certificate in original from the Head of the Institution last attended or issued by a Gazetted Officer or the Panchayat Pradhan in the case of private candidates.
- 5. The character certificate should have been issued within the last 6 months on the day of submission of admission form.
- Original Migration certificate from School Boards other than H.P. Board, should also be submitted. Migration
  Certificate in original is to be enclosed with the H.P. University enrolment form.
- Students of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.-I are required to attach one copy each of Matriculation and 10+2 certificates with the enrolment form/registration form.
- 8. Certificate of SC/ST/OBC/IRDP from Magistrate Class I for those seeking relaxation in age/marks/fee concession.
- Any gap (latest) in the academic career of an applicant must be supported by a documentary evidence/affidavit as a
  proof of his/her activities during the period of gap. If the gap is 3 years or more, the candidate will not be admitted.
   H.P. Domicile Certificate for girl students.

Note: Admission without any of these documents shall be purely provisional and at the candidate's own risk. In case, the candidate fails to produce the required documents on the day of counselling, the admission would stand cancelled.

# RULES REGARDING THE PAYMENT OF FEE

- 1. Fee should be paid (without fine) on the dates fixed by the office for each class and notified from time to time. Delay in payment will be fined accordingly.
- 2. The students who do not pay their dues by the notified dates will be charged Rs. 10/per day as late fee.
- 3. Fee, fine and other dues once paid, will not be refunded.
- 4. Exemption of tuition fee will be available to Himachali Girls only, subject to the production of Bonafide Himachali Certificate.
- Disabled students with more than 40% disability will be exempted of tuition fee, subject to the production of Disability Certificate issued by a competent Medical Authority at the time of admission.
- 6. University examination fee will be charged at the time of filling up of examination form.

## FINES, PENALTIES AND RE-ADMISSION

- 1. In case, students do not deposit their dues on the dates notified, their names will be struck off the roll at the end of the month.
- 2. The names of the students who are absent for six days continuously from any class without proper leave shall be struck off the college rolls. However, the Principal, on his/her discretion, may re-admit such students on payment of the re-admission fee along with a fine (to be decided by the Principal).
- 3. Parent/guardian must accompany such candidates and will assume responsibility for the students' regularity in classes in the remaining period of the academic session.
- 4. Any student whose name is struck off for the second time will not be eligible for re-admission except in exceptional circumstances.
- 5. First re-admission will be allowed within 7 days after the name is struck off on paying fee of Rs. 100/-and fee of Rs. 200/- will be charged for the second re-admission (in exceptional circumstances) within 7 days after the name is struck off the rolls.
- Every student will have to procure No-Dues Certificate from College/Library/Concerned Science Department/ N.S.S./Sports/ College Canteen/Fee Clerk etc. if they want to leave the college.
- 7. The security deposit will lapse if a student does not apply for refund of security within one year of their leaving the college.

#### COURSE EVALUATION (EVALUATION OF THE STUDENTS)

All courses (Core, Elective and Skill Enhancement) involve an evaluation system of students that has the following two components:

- 1. Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course; and
- 2. Annual Examination accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that the student gets in a course.

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA): It has the following components:

- a) Classroom Attendance: Each Student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures/Tutorials/Practicals. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End-Semester/Annual Examination. Those having greater than 75% attendance will be awarded CCA marks as follows:
- b) Mid-Term (Minor) Tests: There will be one class test of 5 marks, after covering 40% syllabus and one midterm of 10 marks after completing 75% syllabus.
- c) Seminar/Assignment: The rest of the 10 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of seminar/assignment given to the students by the concerned course teachers.
- d) Annual Examination/End-Semester Examination (ESE): The remaining 70% of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of an End-semester examination (ESE) /(AE) Annual Examination of three hours duration.

For the Odd Semesters, the ESE will be in the month of October/November and for Even Semesters, it will be in the month of April/May.

# LEAVE RULES FOR STUDENTS

- 1. Student applying for leave should get the recommendation from the teachers of all the classes/subjects in which they are enrolled for sanction of leave.
- A student can proceed on leave with prior permission from all the class/subject teachers and the committee formed for the purpose, but the application should be signed by their parent or guardian.
- 3. Leave for two days can be sanctioned by the Leave Sanctioning Committee. However, leave for 3 days or more shall be sanctioned of by the Principal. Leave application must be submitted in the office.
- 4. Leave on account of illness for more than 3 days, must be accompanied by a Medical Certificate/Hospital
- 5. Students who participate in various inter-college games or other competitions, will have to get their leave sanctioned & noted by the concerned subject teachers before their departure for participation. No exemption/leave will be granted during House Examination. MIGRATION

- 1. No migration certificate can be issued unless the student is registered with the University. A migrating student will not be admitted to the college if the subjects/course studied by him/her previously are not
- 2. The migrating student must submit the following documents/information:

  - Character Certificate from the Principal of the college last attended.
- 3. After migration has been sanctioned and notified by the H.P. University, the student must join the second
- The admission of a student migrating from another university shall be treated as provisional and shall be confirmed when he/she produces the migration certificate issued by the university and a certificate of good
- 5. A student disqualified by another university shall not be given admission during the period of

#### IDENTITY CARD

- It is mandatory for every student to carry their college Identity Card within the college premises. 1.
- A student without an identity card is deemed an outsider. In the event of inspection of identity card 2. during surprise check or for any other reason, if the student is found without Identity Card he/she will be handed over to the police or as the situation may demand.
- The students are not permitted to replace their photographs on the identity cards due to any reason 3. whatsoever.
- It is the personal responsibility of the student to keep their Identity Card in safe custody. In case, the 4. Identity Card is lost or gets misplaced, one has to file an FIR in order to get a duplicate Identity Card issued.

#### LIBRARY AND ITS RULES

- The college provides Library and Reading Room facility to all its students. 1.
- The library subscribes to 13 daily Newspapers, 14 Magazines and 3 Journals. Students are encouraged 2. to avail library facility during college hours on all working days.
- Our college library is also connected to National Library and Information Service Infrastructure for 3. Scholarly Content (N-List) jointly run by UGC-IIT Delhi. This project provides free access to more than 55,000 full e-text books and more than 2000 e-journals to the faculty members and students. Students interested to avail this facility may contact the Librarian.

#### Rules

- Library-Cum-Identity Card will be issued by the Librarian at the time of admission. a.
- Ordinarily, 2 books are issued at a time for 14 days but the Librarian has the right to recall the b. books at any time.
- Reference books are not issued. c.
- In case of loss of a book, the student will have to replace the book or pay fine in addition to the d. present price of the book with the permission of the Principal.
- The student is responsible for the book as soon as it is issued. In case a book is defaced e. /damaged in any way, the book is to be replaced by him/her.

# SCHOLARSHIPS, FEE CONCESSION AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

# DISCIPLINE AND CONDUCT

The Principal and the members of the teaching staff have the power to take disciplinary action against students indulging in reprehensible acts, which may lead to imposition of fine, suspension or expulsion from the college. The following conduct comes within the preview of indiscipline and misconduct:

- Ragging in or around the college campus.
- Damage to college property that includes defacement of walls, black boards and damage to furniture (breaking window panes, plucking flowers, removing notices, tampering with electrical/water fittings etc. is also a break of discipline).
- Loitering around in the campus or corridors during vacant periods causing disturbance to teaching
- Putting up of notices on the College Notice Board without proper authorisation by the college authorities.
- Smoking, chewing of tobacco/gutka, using of cell phones and plying of vehicles within the college premises is strictly prohibited and any infringement may entail a fine of Rs. 100/-
- The Director of Higher Education H. P. vide letter no. EDN-HE (21) B (15)/2017-V has directed that the use of Mobile Phones in the class rooms and campus of Educational Institutions will not be allowed. A particular zone will be fixed by the college authority within the campus where students will be able to use their cell phones.

#### NOTICE BOARD

All the students must read the notices which are pasted on the College Notice Board or displayed on e-notice board on regular basis to keep acquainted with the latest developments in the college.

## ANTI-RAGGING

All students are hereby cautioned that ragging is a criminal offence. "Ragging includes any type of physical or mental torture inflicted by any individual of group, either by words or by conduct, which creates an apprehension in the mind of the person that he/she cannot pursue his/her studies from any mental disturbance or torture created thereby. Any person who aids or encourages such an action shall also be guilty of such ragging."
